


Astro 27 – Field **Astronomy at Pinnacles National Park** (and Laguna Mtn Recreation Area)

Pre-Trip Meeting –


- First Order of Business...

Second Order of Business: Car Pools


- We don't have enough seats in the van to carry more than ~8 or 9 students. The rest will need to get together into carpools with each other

First priority is to get the "Campsite #1" on the hill next to the top parking lot. Next priority is here labelled "Campsite #2, and then if possible Campsite #3. Lay out some gear at each, to make sure others know they're claimed.



3rd Order of Business: Meals

- On nearly all my field classes, I do the cooking, as a way to keep our group together and learning together, and to save effort on your part in bringing stoves and stuff.
- I will cook 4 meals for you, for \$20 (a deal!).
- I need to buy the food and prepare it. Hopefully with an assistant (Anne!), and food prices have gone up. So \$20 for 4 meals is a good deal!
- I'll be buying from TJ's in down, and also get fresh veges and fruits in Watsonville on the drive down, is my usual plan

My Meal Plan

- Friday pasta dinner (simple, but filling we hope). I'll cook this just before sunset, about 6:15pm.
- Leaving time for watching sunset and being able to set up the scopes for Mercury and Venus while it's still light.

Saturday Meals

- Breakfast: I cook my famous French Crepes breakfast, with fresh local fruit and yogurt. Please feel free to bring along any flavorings you'd like to add (nuts, etc?)
- Lunch: YOU provide your own lunch. Make sure it's portable in your rucksack; we'll eat on our hike to Laguna Falls.

- Home-made granola and almond milk, with whatever fruit we still have
- A simple quick breakfast because we need to pack up quick and drive back north to Pinnacles National Park for our hike through the Bear Gulch Caves I hope.

Schedule

- Meet at the campground as soon on Friday as you can. But I will understand if you must arrive late.
- Dinner will be at about 6:15pm
- After dinner telescope observing of the stars and planets and lectures
- If cloudy, we'll have a campfire and I'll lecture around the fire

Essentials to Bring

- WARM CLOTHES!
- It gets cold at night, regardless of how warm it might be in the day.
- Camp chair
- Water
- TP
- Lunches and snacks
- Tent and sleeping gear
- Daypack, notebook
- Headlamp (Home Depot has good ones, rechargeable.) Must have RED LIGHT!!
- Sunscreen, hats
- Shorts for swimming in? Rugged shoes. We may get wet crossing the creek.

Highlights of the Trip

- We'll be stopping regularly along the hikes for short ~10-15 minute "Micro-lectures" on various topics in planetary science, stars, galaxies, ET, etc.
- Laguna Falls is a ~40 ft waterfall at the end of a 2.5 mile hike. The last part of the hike is a steep downhill to the edge of the pool at the bottom of the falls. There's a knotted rope there to help you get up and down that last ~50 ft of elevation






At Laguna Falls






Temperatures are supposed to warm up, finally, by mid April. I hope the water's not too cold, but it'll definitely be cool

- I'd rather give them out THEN, than now. You might forget to bring it




Be sure to bring a flashlight or headlamp. The caves have some very dark sections

To get to the trail head, we'll have to take the Park's shuttle
